TxFMA Fire Marshal Collaborative for the 87th Legislative Session

The TFMA Legislative Committee has been meeting and reviewing the current bills that affect first responders and fire marshals. After full review of the current filed legislation during the 87th Legislature Regular Session, the committee has established a basic guide for the legislative bills currently under consideration.

The TxFMA Legislative Committee has received full support for the following bills from TxFMA Board:

- [HB 4325](#) – Martinez: Relating to the qualifications of a county fire marshal (set for hearing County Affairs 04/15/2021)
- [HB 1240](#) and [SB 659](#) -Coleman, Garnet and Miles, Borris: Relating to the offense of failure to comply with an order from a fire marshal and the authority of certain county employees to issue citations for certain violations. (Left Pending in Committee 3/18/2021)
- [HB 1265](#) - Price, Four: Relating to creating the criminal offense of obstructing or interfering with a first responder or an emergency vehicle. (Referred to Criminal Jurisprudence 3/4/2021)
- [SB 500](#) - Miles, Borris: Relating to creating the criminal offense of operating a boarding home facility without a permit in certain counties and municipalities. (Referred to Health & Human Services 03/09/21)

- [HB 2569](#) – Cortez, Relating to the dates a retail fireworks permit holder may sell fireworks to the public (Left pending in committee 04/01/2021)
- [HB 83](#) – Toth, Relating to the dates a retail fireworks permit holder may sell fireworks to the public. (Left pending in committee 04/08/2021)
